What are we learning in math's next week (week commencing 24.6.19)?

Reception will be continuing with their learning of number bonds to 10 e.g. 2 + 8 = 10, 5 + 5 = 10.

Year 1 will be following on from last week's weight and volume work. They will be looking at how to record using the correct language... heavy or light, more or less, empty or full. This will include using nonstandard forms of measurement for example - how many cubes does it weigh.

Year 2 will be using the mathematical skills learned so far to reason about number.

Their job is to check that the standards we say the children have achieved at the end of the year are accurate. 


Never giving up
