What are we learning in math's after the holiday (week commencing 7.1.19)?

Reception will be finding number doubles; counting feet and pairs.

Year 1 will be **telling the time** using the hour and half past. Using words associated with time - relating to dates, including days of the week, weeks, months and years.

Year 2 will be adding two, 2-digit numbers and learning to add and subtract through 10 e.g. 25 + 26 = 20 + 20 + 11 = 51
