## What are we learning in math's next week (week commencing 7.10.19)?

Reception will be counting, investigating and exploring numbers 9 and 10.

Year 1 will be using the language greater than/ less than and equal to while ordering objects and numbers. We will be doing lots of work on number position.

Year 2 will be Y2 will be learning to recall all number bonds to and within 10 and use these to reason with and calculate bonds to and within 20, recognising other associated additive relationships (e.g. if 7 + 3 = 10, then 17 + 3 = 20; if 7 - 3 = 4, then 17 - 3 = 14.
