

## **Spelling Homework**

This week we would like Year 1 children to recap the following spelling patterns/rules:

The er sound (like uh) is often represented by the letters er when it comes at the end of word

The long (i) sound is sometimes represented by the letters igh.

The sound (eer) is often represented by the letters ear.

The sound (air) is often represented by the letters air.

The sound ure as in pure and sure.
