## What are we learning in math's next week (week commencing 14.1.19)?

Reception will be continuing to find number doubles; counting feet and pairs.
Year 1 will be telling the time. Solving time problems such as what time will it be in half an hour if it is 3pm now. Sequence events in order using words like before and after, next, first, today, yesterday, tomorrow, morning, afternoon and evening.

Year 2 will be learning how to add and subtract any 2 two-digit number using an efficient strategy within 100 (e.g. 48 + 35; 72-17)
