Bye Bye Theo!


Today we have said bye to Theo. He's off to a new school next week. We wish Theo well. We've enjoyed spending time with him. He's made us laugh lots with his funny stories.

Is your child school ready?



In 2018, there were over 900 <u>laboratory-confirmed measles cases</u> in England.

Measles is a highly infectious viral illness that can be very unpleasant and can lead to serious health complications and in rare cases can be fatal.

We want to make sure that all pre-school children are protected from Measles, Mumps and Rubella and are fully vaccinated before they start school this September.

We are urging parents and guardians of all pre-school children to check with their GP that they are fully up to date with the 2 doses of the MMR vaccine.

Let this be one less thing you have to worry about before they start school.

Fire – Please take a moment to read our fire evacuation plan. Thank you.

On hearing the bell—a prolonged ring, please leave the school via the evacuation route displayed in each room. If you are working with a child/children please escort them outside—do not allow them to return to their classroom.

Our meeting point is the far corner of the large playground. Please ensure the child/children join/s their class to take part in roll call.

The school's admin team will distribute the registers and the visitor book will be checked to ensure all helpers have evacuated safely.
