Are you a parent or carer who uses childcare in Sheffield? And if so, can you spare 5 to 10 minutes to tell us about it via our <u>online survey</u>?


We are asking you to take that time because we know how important childcare is to you. We want you to tell us what we're getting right and where there are problems.

#### Mobile phone use in school

Despite a reminder on last week's newsletter, staff have commented that several parents and grandparents are still using mobile phones on school premises.

We ask you to keep mobile phones out of sight whilst on school grounds to ensure safety for our pupils.

In 2009, a Nursery worker was convicted of crimes that involved taking inappropriate pictures of children with her mobile phone. Since then, all settings with children under five are encouraged not to allow the use of mobile phones on school premises. We follow this advice.

I am not suggesting parents or visitors to school are using their phones inappropriately but it is an impossible thing for us to monitor and police and therefore ensure we are keeping all our children safe.


