Weekly Reading Tasks	Weekly Phonics Tasks
<p>Monday- Discuss with your child what the word resilience means. Do they know? Could you look it up in a dictionary? Ask your child to write in their books a definition of the word resilient.</p>	<p>Monday- Learn your weekly spellings. Think of some other words that have the same spelling patterns as the rules</p>
<p>Tuesday- Ask your child to share with you a time they have been resilient. For example, it could be when they were learning to ride their bike or when they were learning to use chopsticks in school.</p>	<p>Tuesday- Learn your weekly spellings. Play spelling tennis. You write a letter, then your grown up writes the next letter and so on.</p>
<p>Wednesday- Share 'Too Shy for Show and Tell' with your child (please see the PDF attachment your child's class teacher has sent.) Can they draw a story map to sequence the story? What happened at the beginning of the story? In the middle? At the end? Draw your story map in either your book or a piece of paper.</p>	<p>Wednesday- Learn your weekly spellings. Using a word from your child's spelling word list, say a sentence out loud. Can your child write the sentence you are saying?</p>
<p>Thursday- Share 'Too Shy for Show and Tell' with your child again. Discuss with your child how Sam has been resilient in the story. Can they write a few sentences in their books to explain?</p>	<p>Thursday- Learn your weekly spellings. How many times can you write your spellings in 3 minutes? Be quick – no time to waste!</p>
<p>Friday- Ask your child to make, do or find something they would like to show for 'Show and Tell'. Can you record them showing their creation and post it to Seesaw. Have they got the resilience to do it?</p>	<p>Friday- Learn your weekly spellings. Play a different game on phonics play this week and revise all phase 5 sounds. Don't forget to use your free login!</p>

<p>Monday- Look at the attached images of animals mixed up. Give them all names – write a sentence about how each one might move or look or speak.</p>	<p>Monday- Select containers, this could be different sized glasses, jugs, bowls etc. Ask your child to predict which will hold the most/least water. Pour cups of water to see which holds the most/least. For objects that are similar in size, predict how much water it will hold and then use a measuring jug to read the capacity.</p>
<p>Tuesday- Create your own mixed up animal(s). Write some information about it. What is it called? Where does it live? What sound does it make? What does it eat? How does it move? Use Switch Zoo online if you need some inspiration: https://switchzoo.com/zoo.htm</p>	<p>Tuesday- Have a go at the NRICH challenge and see how far you can throw a bean bag then measure the distance using paces.</p>
<p>Wednesday- Make a flip book of mixed up animals. Put speech bubbles coming out of your creatures' mouths. Share it with someone and upload it onto Seesaw so that we can enjoy it too.</p>	<p>Wednesday - Ask your child to find a book. Can they find 3 items which are heavier than the book and 3 items which are lighter than the book?</p>
<p>Thursday- Make a treasure hunt – write clues to hide in different places. Can your grown up follow the clues to where the treasure is finally hidden? E.g. Look behind the plant pot.....Check near the goalpost</p>	<p>Thursday- Sit with your child and look outside a window for 5 minutes. Tally the different types of transport that passes by. Can your child record this information in a bar chart or pictogram with your help?</p>
<p>Friday- Make a list of all the things you have done at SNI that have made you laugh or smile.
