#### What are we learning in math's next week (week commencing 20.5.19)?

Reception will be solving simple number problems within 20 using all our skills.

Year 1 will be learning to share between groups fairly. (e.g. if I had 4 apples how many would 2 children have each?)

Year 2 will be revising all number bonds to and within 10 and use these to reason with and calculate bonds to and within 20, recognising other associated additive relationships (e.g. if 7 + 3 = 10, then 17 + 3 = 20; if 7 - 3 = 4, then 17 - 3 = 14).


Sessions will be held at the Junior school. Places will be allocated on a first come first served basis.
